thanking her, Linda opened her hand. Tears burst from her eyes... it was 3 pennies.

Luke 21:1-4 "Jesus saw the rich putting their gifts into the temple treasury. He also saw a poor widow put in two very small copper coins... He said, "This poor widow has put in more than all the others. All these people gave their gifts out of their wealth, but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on."

No amount is too small. All the small amounts add up, and God makes them big!

- * Thank you for all the pocket change you've been collecting for the orphanage. It's been such a joy to see how creative you've been in your giving.

ORPHANAGE UPDATE

It's been a very difficult time for George and Eugenia and all the Romanians involved in running the orphanage.

Earlier this spring Brummitt Ministries helped provide what they needed to cultivate land, and plant crops so the boys could be taught to farm, and at the same time grow food for the orphanage. They would have fresh vegetables this summer, and food to help them through the winter. over -

As you probably heard in the news this spring, devastating floods wiped out much of the farming in Romania.

Eugenia reported in July that the land that the orphanage was farming was also affected, and that all the results of their strenuous farming efforts were destroyed.

ORPHANAGE NEEDS

The following are immediate concerns and needs:

- * Food - They need finances to buy food to eat now, and to store up for the upcoming Siberian-like winter.
- * Heating oil for the orphanage building. One of the greatest hardships for the boys was when Russia cut off oil supplies to Romania last year. Heating oil ran out in the middle of the snowy winter. This was an unexpected hardship, but they now face another hardship that is not unexpected - paying the cost of heating oil for the upcoming winter, which begins early there. It's expensive, and they have little money to buy it with. They need help filling their tank.
- * A van for orphanage use. We have created a separate fund just for "the van".

People are always asking how they can help, and what our needs are when we travel overseas. The following are needs that we would really like to help provide:

- * We would love to bless our interpreter, who works so hard, and does so much for us - help her a little with her financial needs. We'll be staying with her and her family in their house for the first time. When Bruce was there about the time the Iron Curtain fell, she gave here life to Jesus and began interpreting for Bruce.
- * The orphanage needs basic everyday supplies.

We can purchase supplies, in Romania and other parts of Europe. It's cheaper for us to buy things for the orphanage there, than to ship them, or take them on the plane when we go.

We do not need you to send us Clothes:

Christians, who live in Europe, give us clothes to take to the orphanage. It costs a lot for us to send clothes, or pay the extra baggage fees to take them with us from America.

- * Bibles and Christian tracts written in their languages - to evangelize with. Extra finances are needed to purchase them.

We spread the Gospel in various ways everywhere we go. Our most important focus is on helping everyone around us come closer to Jesus.

- * Please pray for finances to come in to pay for our travels to and from Romania, for expenses while we are overseas, such as gasoline, tolls, food... and for monthly home expenses in America while we're gone in October and November.
